Creation Care Conference 2022



We held our first Creation Care Conference on 9 – 10 September 2022 to mark the start of the Season of Creation. This conference aimed to provide a meeting place for Christians to learn about creation care and find opportunities for collaboration.

Our theme for the conference was “The Garden of Eden” to remind us of our role as stewards of God’s creation, reflect the conference’s role as a gathering place, and point to the future restoration of all creation.

Over the 2 days, more than **130 people** gathered to learn and share alongside each other over a keynote, plenary, and **12 workshops** from practitioners, pastors, and theologians.

Terrarium Workshops

Our conference team ran **8 workshops in 4 churches**, where **over 50 people** participated in making their own terrariums using recycled materials.



Prints and Stickers

We collaborated with two local artists, Kenneth (@canlaken) and Dorcas (@earthtodorcas), to design prints and stickers featuring wildlife found in Singapore. We have sold **53 prints** and **322 stickers**.

Guided Reflective Walks: A Walk in God's Garden

Our guided nature walks are an avenue for believers to slow down and appreciate how God's character is seen in His creation.

In 2022, we ran **6 runs** of this walk and we were honoured to have facilitated walks with Yishun Christian Church and Christ Methodist Church. Our volunteers led **104 participants** on a curated trail where they were inspired to recognise the beauty of God's creation, and to reflect on your relationships with the natural world.

Contemplative Beach Cleanups

Our contemplative beach cleanups are a tangible and public opportunity for Christians to care for the community.

We pair the clean ups with a time of guided reflection to prepare ourselves for the clean up, and pray for the restoration of our oceans.

In 2022, we conducted **2 contemplative beach cleanups** at East Coast Park with more than **28 participants**. Additionally, we were honoured to have assisted **7 organisations** with their beach clean ups.

STRATEGIC PLAN

Creating a Community of Practice

Bringing together creation care practitioners and church groups to encourage, inspire, and support one another in this journey.

In July 2023, we will be organising the very first Creation Care Community of Practice – a biannual gathering of Christians advocating for creation care in their church communities.

This provides a unique opportunity for Christians passionate about caring for the environment to connect, learn from each other, and share their experiences over food and fellowship. Members of the CCCoP cross-pollinate ideas on how to integrate environmental stewardship into their churches and build relationships with like-minded individuals. This is a chance to be part of a growing movement in Singapore.
